**ORDER GRANTING
UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR
CLASS CERTIFICATION AND
PRELIMINARY APPROVAL
OF CLASS SETTLEMENT**

Before the Court is the parties' Unopposed Motion for Class Certification and Preliminary Approval of Class Settlement, ECF No. 52. Plaintiff is represented by Kirk D. Miller, Shayne Sutherland, and Brian G. Cameron. Defendants are represented by John S. Devlin and Taylor Washburn.

The parties indicate they have entered into a settlement agreement and ask the Court to certify the proposed class and preliminarily approve the class settlement. They indicate the proposed Settlement resolves all of the Settlement Class's claims against Defendants in exchange for Defendants' agreement to

1 provide certain monetary and non-monetary consideration to the Settlement Class
2 members. Good cause exists to grant the motion and preliminarily approve the
3 class settlement.

4 Accordingly, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:**

5 1. The parties' Unopposed Motion for Class Certification and Preliminary
6 Approval of Class Settlement, ECF No. 52, is **GRANTED**.

7 2. As requested by the parties, the following deadlines are imposed:

8 a. Within 10 days of entry of this Order, Defendants shall provide
9 expected class administration costs to Class Administrator.

10 b. Within 15 days of entry of this Order, Defendants shall provide class
11 contact information to Class Administrator.

12 c. Within 30 days of the entry of this Order, the class notice shall be
13 delivered.

14 d. Within 30 days of the entry of this Order, class counsel's fees and costs
15 motion shall be submitted.

16 e. The deadline for claims, exclusions and objections is 90 days after
17 entry of this Order.
