

Judge rules on motion for an order governing extrajudicial statements

On July 26, 2018, District Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson denied James A. Wolfe's motion for an order governing extrajudicial statements, which Wolfe had sought to prevent President Trump and DOJ officials from making further public comments about the case.

Buckley Sandler issued a statement in response to the ruling: We respectfully disagree with the Court's decision. We will be studying the Judge's ruling closely as we consider our options, including Mr. Wolfe's appellate rights. We remain very concerned that Mr. Wolfe's Sixth Amendment right to a fair trial could be prejudiced by further comments by President Trump.
